Keynote

Bertrand Piccard

Psychiatrist and explorer, Bertrand Piccard made history by accomplishing two aeronautical firsts — flying around the world non-stop in a balloon, and more recently in a solar-powered airplane plane without fuel. Pioneer in his way to consider ecology through the lens of profitability, he began working in the early 2000s to promote renewable energies and clean technologies. His new project, Climate Impulse, aims to demonstrate the potential of green hydrogen in aviation.

She has overseen the legislative proposal and the negotiations on the recast Energy Performance of Buildings Directive and is now working on its implementation. Before joining the Commission, she worked in the European Parliament for many years, notably in the Secretariats of the ENVI and ITRE committees. As a legal clerk, she worked at the European Court of Justice, the German Federal Ministry for the Environment and law firms specialized in energy and environmental law. Nina Neumann is a fully qualified lawyer and holds an LLM in European law from the University of Cambridge.

Mirella Amalia Vitale is the Senior Vice President of Marketing, Communication and Public Affairs for the ROCKWOOL Group.

Thibault Girardot is a Sustainable Finance Policy Officer at the WWF European Policy Office. He works on the development and implementation of EU policies aimed at aligning the financial sector with the EU's environmental and climate objectives.

Before joining WWF, he was a Policy Consultant at Better Europe Public Affairs, advising civil society organizations on legislative files related to environmental issues, corporate responsibility, human rights, and socio-economic policies. He closely monitored political and legislative developments within the EU institutions and developed advocacy strategies.

He holds a Master's degree in Environment and Resource Management from Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam and a Master's in European Affairs from Sciences Po Lyon.

Ciaran Cuffe

Ciarán Cuffe is an architect and urban planner, currently serving as Co-Chair of the European Greens. He is also a Board Member at the Buildings Performance Institute Europe (BPIE). From 2019 to 2024, he was a **Member of**

Mechthild Wörsdörfer

Mechthild Wörsdörfer is the Deputy Director-General of the Directorate-General for Energy (DG ENER) at the European Commission. She previously held the position of Director for Sustainability, Technology, and Outlooks at the International Energy Agency (IEA) from 2018 to 2021. Before joining the IEA, she was Director at DG ENER, overseeing renewables, research and innovation, and energy efficiency. Mechthild also led energy policy development, including the Energy Union Framework Strategy, and worked on international relations and economic analysis at DG ENER.

Eva Chamizo

Eva Chamizo is the Director of European Affairs at IBERDROLA and serves as the Secretary of the Board of Directors for IBERDROLA Internacional S.A. She is also a Member of the Board of Directors of the Spanish Chamber of Commerce in Belgium and Luxembourg. Eva has a background in law and was a State Attorney. From 2001 to 2015, she served as the Head of the Legal Service at the Permanent Representation of Spain to the EU, where she represented Spain as Agent to the Court of Justice of the European Union. Eva was involved in the Intergovernmental Conferences for the Constitution and Lisbon Treaty (2003/2004) and contributed to the drafting team of the Treaty on Stability, Coordination, and Governance in the Economic and Monetary Union (2012). Before her public sector roles, she worked as an Attorney in the private sector.

Paul Kenny

Paul Kenny is the CEO of the European Heat Pump Association (EHPA). A mechanical engineer with a Master's in energy, Paul has extensive experience in energy policy across Ireland and the EU. He led a local energy agency for eight years, driving clean energy transitions and establishing a successful one-stop shop for home energy upgrades. As policy advisor to the Irish climate and energy Minister, Paul contributed to Ireland's energy transformation, achieving a 6.8% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions in 2023 and supporting heat pump deployment. He founded a retrofit company focused on heat pumps and has actively influenced policy development.

Julia Poliscanova

Julia Poliscanova is the Director for Vehicles & E-mobility at Transport & Environment (T&E), leading the organization's work on vehicle emissions, electrification, and supply chains across Europe. She oversees policies on EU car CO2 standards, sustainable batteries, and critical raw materials, and represents T&E on the Global Battery Alliance. Before joining T&E, Julia worked as Senior EU Environment Expert for the Mayor of London and as an advisor to an MEP, focusing on renewables, energy efficiency, and sustainable transport. She holds a Bachelor's in European Politics and French from Goldsmiths College, London, and an MSc in Energy Engineering from Heriot-Watt University, specializing in batteries and fuel cells.
